Christina L. Kunz is Professor of Law at William Mitchell College of Law in St. Paul, Minnesota, where she has taught since 1980. Her teaching areas include Contracts, UCC Sales, International Sales of Goods, Negotiating and Drafting Business Agreements (focused on technology contracts), and Electronic Commercial Law.

She has helped to develop electronic commercial law since 1990. Currently, she is an ABA Advisor to the ULC Drafting Committee for a uniform act on “Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets.” She actively participates in the ABA Cyberspace Law Committee (in the Business Law Section), has served as a vice chair of that Committee, is a frequent speaker on the topic nationwide, and has co-authored groundbreaking articles on electronic contract formation. Elected to ALI in 2002, she served on the Members Consultative Group on the Principles of the Law of Software Contracts.

Her e-commerce expertise supplements her longstanding interest in Uniform Commercial Code (UCC) sales law and contract law. For more than two decades, she has taught contract and technology law to supply chain and purchasing professionals across the country. She has served as a vice chair of the ABA Committee on the UCC, an advisor to the UCC Art. 2A drafting process, and an ABA observer in the UCC Art. 2 redraft process. She has co-authored innovative textbooks on contract law and sales of goods.
